I did not attend my graduation ceremony; I no longer had the space to be something I was not.

The last time I cycled was in that ill-fitting, ill chosen binder. I did not bring my bike to college. Some days it felt like missing a limb. I had to find different ways to cope; I had to become someone different, someone less popular, someone less accepted and praised. I did not bring my bike to college, but I brought four new, better binders.

Autumn consoled me. Autumn sheared the leaves off dying trees and used its breeze to discard my unneeded worries. Autumn made me a dandelion; autumn, with its promise of a new school year, of a fresh start, made me free.
